brings together community leaders from many states, at a luncheon meeting on 28th April:

The venue was a well-known restaurant reputed for its Indian delicacies. Attendees included prominent community leaders from Karnataka, Hyderabad, Uttar Pradesh, and Bhatkal. And, the lunch was hosted by Bihar Anjuman's local chapter of Dammam-Khobar whose objective of spreading awareness about Bihar Anjuman's aims & objectives, its education-focused welfare activities, driving forces behind its success, and how the same could easily be replicated by any organization anywhere else, were highly acclaimed by one and all.

Janab Salahuddin Khan Sb anchored the event, and invited brother Ziaul Haque Nadwi Sb to start the program with recitation of Quran.

Visiting brother Engineer Shakeel Ahmad Sb was then invited to brief the attendees about Bihar Anjuman. Shakeel Sb made a power-point presentation of an hour, taking the audience through an incredible journey, by ordinary persons aspiring for extra-ordinary success of the community, which has left all other voluntary organizations wondering. Wondering, because Bihar Anjuman works without a formal structure, without an office, thus with zero overheads, a proposition that is packed with pleasant surprises. Commencing the online networking on 14th June 2004, helping five students by means of scholarship of Rs. 1,200/= per month to each of them selected in AMU on a merit-cum-means basis, the network could pool enough resources to establish 21 RAHBAR Coaching Centres in 14 districts of Bihar and 6 districts of Jharkhand, each spending Rs. 11,000/= per month, an ITI (RAHBAR Technical Training Centre) providing govt approved ITI certificates in Plumbing, Electrician and Civil Draftsman courses, a residential madrasa-cum-school only for girls to receive free quality holistic education, guidance and training. The network is currently helping more than 25 students with monthly scholarship ranging from Rs. 1,500/= to Rs. 2,500/=, apart from paying their annual fees. It has helped community members in moments of crisis by raising resources for them, at individual levels as well as during natural calamities like floods and earthquakes.

If the following picture, shared on their website, was not presented to the audience, it would have been hard to believe how all of this was possible in a short period of seven years:

OUR JOURNEY TO THE DAY OF RESURRECTION PART-XI

In last issue I have concluded the Shafa'at Kubra (Grand Intercession). Here is the next stage "Distribution of Record Book (Statement of Accounts)". It will be given either in right hand or in the left hand. He who gets it in his right hand will be happy and will show it to his relatives and friends to read. Allah Almighty says:-

Then, as for him who is given his record in his right hand, he will say: Take, read my book! Surely I knew that I should have to meet my reckoning. Then, he will be in blissful state, in a high Garden whereof the clusters are in easy reach. (And it will be said to those therein): Eat and drink at ease for that which you sent on before you in past days. (Al-Haaqqah 19-24).

He who is getting it in his left hand will be regretful to himself but regret will not save him. Allah Almighty says:-

But as for him who is given his record in his left hand, he will say: Oh, would that I had not been given my book, and knew not what my reckoning is! Oh, would that it had been death! My wealth has not availed me. My power has gone from me. (It will be said): Take him and fetter him, and then expose him to hell-fire. And then insert him in a chain whereof the length is seventy cubits. Lo! He used not to believe in Allah the Tremendous, and urged not on the feeding of the wretched. Therefore, has he no lover here this day, nor any food save filth, which none but sinners eat. (Al-Haaqqah 21-37).

First the book of Allah (Quran) was given in this world to the mankind to read and pass his life accordingly. In this connection the first five verses of the Quran was ascended by Allah saying:-

Read: In the name of your Lord Who created. Created man from a clot.

Read: And your Lord is the Most Bounteous, Who taught by the pen,

taught man that which he knew not. (Al-Alaq 1-5)

And NOW (at the Day of Resurrection) he will be said to read his own book of record he made. See if his record is in par with the Book of Allah (Quran). So, Qurans says:-

(And it will be said to him) Read your Book. Your soul is sufficient as reckoner against you this day. (Al-Isra 14)

He who will have his book in his right hand will be lightly dealt (See Al-Inshiqaqq 7-8). He will not be asked why he did not do so and so deeds (non-obligatory). Best deeds will be taken and bad deeds will be written-off. (See Al-Ahqaab 16).

Why SABA?

Dr. Imtiyaz Ahmad Khan Sb., a consultant physician, who retired from the UK govt health services, was among those who strongly supported the idea of initiating this service. In his words:

I live in the UK, and I have a few friends from professional families (from Bihar and other Urdu-speaking regions) who are looking for rishta for their daughters or sons. It is very difficult for people, living in the West, the Middle East, and the Emirates, to find properly brought up match in a practicing professional Muslim family, because people don't know each other and don't know where such families reside. It is much easier to find out about potential matches in India and Pakistan. It is really a major problem for noble practicing Islamic families.

Shaadi (marriage) is the most important event that transforms a Muslim youth into a complete man or a woman, prepares him or her to share responsibilities. Marriage is a sacred act, and looking for the right partner is essential for a long-lasting relationship to begin. Therefore, matrimonial has become an integral part of the Anjuman's activities.

India and Pakistan: Lengthening Shadows of a Toxic Past

India and Pakistan: Lengthening Shadows of a Toxic Past – Part2

Sixty-four years after they parted ways, their toxic past and violent split still continues to haunt India and Pakistan and hundreds of millions of people on both sides of the divide ... By Asma Anjum*

Note: Part-1 of this long essay appeared in the April issue of BaKhabar. The next parts of this historical-but-still-highlyrelevant essay would appear in coming issues of BaKhabar.

This whole business of their loyalty being under suspicion is something that simply bewilders Indian Muslims. We are forever in the dock. Khader Mohiuddin captures the predicamentrather well:

My religion is a conspiracy My prayer meetings are a conspiracy

My lying quiet is a conspiracy

My desire to have friends is a conspiracy

My ignorance, my backwardness, a conspiracy

On the other hand, says Khader

lt's no conspiracy

[for the Hindu] to make me a refugee

In the very country of my birth

It's no conspiracy to poison the air I breathe

And the space I live in

It's certainly no conspiracy

To cut me to pieces

And then imagine an uncut Bharat!

The part I liked most with reference to the relationship between cricket and India-Pakistan equation comes here: Cricket matches weigh and measure my patriotism

Never mind my love for my motherland

What is important is how much I hate the other land!

Thus the Indian Muslim has been carrying this cross of partition around his neck since it transpired. An interesting fact lesser known perhaps is that, out of the 522 Indian soldiers who died in the Kargil war, 38 were Muslims, which makes them 10 per cent of the total Indian Muslim population, which implies that more Muslims died in that manufactured war of Kargil. Now let's see what Jinnah thought about the 'left over' Muslims' plight, as Roy explains, "An intelligent man like Jinnah must have foreseen this tragic consequence of what he demanded."

Roy therefore categorically declares Jinnah to be 'innocent' of this historic blunder. He adds, "Therefore, I for one do not believe that he really wanted partition of the country. Like a gambler, over confident of his wits, he staked high, believing



that the other party would compromise on his terms. That he would have been for the best of all concerned .But the latter having taken up the attitude of all or nothing, Jinnah was driven to the bitter end _of gaining a victory he himself dreaded and which he did not survive." [1981:34]

Roy was a legendary figure of our independence movement and his words carry a lot of significance. He has essentially captured the dilemma of Jinnah and the Muslims. Another stinging reality is that Hindu and Sikh refugees who were forced to leave their lands and belongings in Pakistan and came to India, were willingly assimilated here without much ado. However the same cannot be said about those who left their country of birth for the 'Promised Land'. The common perception is that they were never made to feel welcome there and are still referred to as Mohajirs. There it is the Punjab and Punjabiyat which dominates everything and everywhere. This refusal to integrate the migrants into their land is something that negates the very basis for which Pakistan was created. So unfortunate for a country which was created in the name of Islam whose first teaching is about universal brotherhood as all men [and women] come from that one man named Adam.

Prof. Sunil Khilnani, Director, King's India Institute, London, admits in his book, Idea of India, that the trend to dump the responsibility for the division of the country on the Muslims by Hindu nationalists is quite old. And the modern research has, in his words, only "complicated" the picture.

Prof. Khilnani probes the reasons behind this sense of alienation in the minority community in decades and years before the Partition. He observes that the Muslim demand for a separate state deepened as a reaction to the practical experience of the Congress rule in key Indian provinces following the 1937 elections which fostered a sense of alienation among the Muslims. The Congress governments were heavily influenced by Hindu nationalists consequently losing the trust of the Muslims. This convinced them that in the post British India, they would be under the thumb of the majority community.

Aminah was taught about this lesson just from childhood, sharing everything with each other in their limited means. They were six siblings' three brothers and three sisters. She was the fourth in the row. The father used to work as a construction worker from morning till evening, while the mother used to work in the nearby homes as a maid. All of them grew up in this shanty slums dwelling of only two small rooms with a tin roof. It had one small bathroom and toilet to share. They were lucky enough to have a bathroom, a water tap and an Indian commode to use. Most of their neighbours used to go in the outside fields. She was quite small, maybe six, when she started going with her mother to work. It was so common in this lower class community; they believed that a baby is born with a mouth but two hands to support the family.

She was greatly fascinated by the life styles of those homes she worked in. They were full from all the modern luxuries, TVs, DVDs, computers, phones, a lot of toys and books. She was not allowed to touch anything

or play with anything. When doing cleaning she would only touch them just to keep them aside. She sometimes looked at the pictures and writings which looked like some pictures to her too.

She would look at all the bajis and bhaijans with envy who used to read books and sit on computers. "Could I be like one of them, to understand what is written there?" One day while coming back home, she asked her mom "Can I go to school like other kids, I want to read and write like the bajis and bhaijans." "No, don't ever think about it, we are poor people and none of your older brother and sisters go to school. Therefore how can you." "But I want to read and write" Her mom just kept quiet and didn't reply. Her mother sometimes used to pray and

teach them kalma "La ilaha illalah Mohammadur rassolullah." (There is no God except Allah and Mohammad is his prophet), bismillah (with the name of Allah) alhamdolillah (thanks to Allah). She used to listen to adhaans coming from nearby masjids five times a day. She knew that she was a Muslim and Muslims to go to masjid but nothing more than that.

There only target was to earn more money to put a concrete roof on their house. Because there was a lot of noise during rains and leakage some times. One day she collected some papers from the garbage and brought that home with her. Then she took a pointed stone and started copying them on the mud floor. A lot of nice sketches were drawn. This became one of her favorite game. She didn't like the other games played by other kids. She called this game the game of writing.... One day she realized that a lot of good papers and used pencils were thrown in trash. Aminah collected all those and brought home and then started writing and copying over them. Her mom would stealthily watch her but somehow she liked her game too.

A new family has moved in the new house. They hired them because of their good reputation in the neighbors. Aminah learned that this baji has arrived from America. She was very nice and gentle towards her. On the very first day of the job she asked her mother, "Maasi send her to school and get her educated. She should not do this work, it's a child labor and this is not good."Her mother understood half of the dialogue. "Baji we are poor people and I need her help. My eldest daughter takes care of small siblings and home. The second one is full time employed with a baji and the boy goes to a workshop."

"OK then when she is finished with work send her to me and your other daughter too and I will start teaching them a little bit." So gleefully she looked at her mother and her mother told baji about her favorite game. She was so excited that it got so difficult for her to wait until evening. She took shower, wore nice clean clothes and along with her older sister went to baji. She welcomed and told them that for the first one hour she will teach them about our deen Islam the basic things and then some Urdu and English.

First she checked that how much they knew and then started with first two ayas of Alfatiha. Alhamdolillah rabbil alameen arrahmaan irrahim. Then she taught them a few of Arabic, Urdu and English Alphabet. Aminaah was so excited to learn the sounds of all her drawings and artwork. She felt like those dumb letters have started talking. This was the happiest day of her life. At the end of the class baji gave them some candies. It was their choice to keep the books home or with baji. Aminaah brought her books home. During night for a long time she read those letters again and again what the baji had taught in the dim light. She heard her father, "Aminah turn off the light and go to sleep." Whole night she dreamt about reading and writing. Then it became a routine going to baji for taking lessons. Aminah was doing better than her older sister. Baji taught them about the basics of Islam and how to offer salah.

Now Aminah started gathering small sentences in Urdu and words in

English. She was very good at writing and would complete her home work with great enthusiasm.

Baji has invited some friends for tea today and she asked the girls to help her. After the ladies seated she asked both the girls to come over. She had already introduced both of them. "Aminaah recite Al-Fatiha". Both of them were already prepared for the presentation. She put her scarf on head and started with istiaadha and Basmallah in a nice confident voice. The other girl recited Hamd and Naat. All the ladies seemed very delighted and impressed and hugged both of them. Baji discussed about some facility with them to teach

these working class kids. "Let us first do a survey in the area about the families and their kids and that how many of them wish to learn?" At least 10-12 kids agreed to start their learning or education process. Aminaah was the monitor of class. Now the class has started in the patio or verandah of the house. She should reach there ahead of time; organize the desk, black board and then spread the rug for the kids to sit on. Two of other bajis joined. One of them used to teach English and the other Math. They had pretty colored books, pencils crayons, sharpeners, erasers, note books and nice back packs. Aminah was so excited about all this that she sometimes would not believe it real. She was learning and picking up very quickly and was a girl with such a nice manners.

One day baji called both of her parents to discuss something important with them. Aminah was a bit upset for not knowing what is going on. Her mother told her the next day, "Baji wants to put you in a regular school for studies and she will bear all the expenses." She was startled to learn that. The next day baji took her to a nearby Government school. She took a test there and was selected for 3rd grade. Baji bought her books and uniform and directed her about going to school regularly. She could come in the evening to her house for learning Quran and doing her homework. Her sister was more interested in learning Quran, a bit of reading, writing, cooking and baking.

The years passed by Aminaah proved to be an excellent student. She earned many prizes, awards and scholarships. With the help of baji and encouragement of her parents, this small girl is now a big woman. She has a teaching degree and she opened a school in her area with the help of baji and her friends. Baji was the torch bearer and mentor for her. She named this school after her. She is the principal of this school.

Now her family has moved to a much decent house. Most of the siblings are married and she is soon going to be married to a nice young qualified man and that man is no one else but baji's youngest brother.



The need for Muslim to Introspect: Education

Sachar Committee report has rightly pointed out the backwardness of the Muslim community vis-a-vis the other community in India. It has aptly analyzed the status of backwardness and categorized it. On most counts the Muslim community lags behind other communities. Who are to be blamed for this backwardness?

Most of us, as a Muslim, point our finger to the external factors such as the government, the society as a whole and the conspirators that does not want this community to progress and drumbeat and declare that the atmosphere is not conducive for the growth of Muslim in India just because Muslims are in minority. But have we ever thought why other minorities such as Christians, Parsees and Sikhs have better statistics than us when it comes to progress and better life even though they are also a minority. This fallacy has no base as even among Muslims one can find few subcommunities and people who are at par with other communities in progress. Did we ever introspect where does the main blame lie? Aren't we to take the major share of blame?

It is a basic fact that we as a community have not yet awaken to take responsibility of progress in our own hand, but we always look at others to do the things for us. I do not say that external factors have not been responsibility for our backwardness, but I fully believe that we are the one who need to be blamed in the first place. Throughout the history in every geographical distribution, minorities do face extra problem and issues and thus it is a fact that this cannot be ever resolved fully. But then to work out a realistic solution, we have to accept this fact that our destination is in our hand.

All the factors that the Sachar Committee has studied, shows the backwardness of Muslims has its genesis in education. The literacy rate among the Muslims is well below the national level. Twenty-five percent of Muslim children in the 6-14 year age group have either never attended school or have dropped out. Drop-out rates among Muslims are higher at the level of primary, middle and higher secondary. In premier colleges only one out of twenty-five under-graduate students and one out of fifty post-graduate students is a Muslim.

It is an irony of this community! The very first word of the Quran that was given to the Prophet was Iqraâ (Read) and not only that, further down the verse it mentions qalam (Pen) [Quran 96:1-5]. Verse [Quran 39:9] poses a question to the people whether those that have knowledge and those who do not have are deemed equal! Added to this, the word IIm (knowledge) is found 750 times in Quran. Even there are many sayings by Prophet which directed the Muslims to seek knowledge whenever and wherever they could. It is a well-known fact that the captives of war were released if they could teach the people to read and write. "Indeed the worst of the beasts in the eyes of God are those deaf and dumb people who don't use their intellect." (Quran 8:22]

Regrettably, most of our religious leaders as well as, the-well-to-do people of this community waste most of their energies on only highlighting the causes of the problem that faces us. They shout these out from the pulpit and then take solace in the fact that a messiah like figure will come down from the sky and relieve us of all our sufferings. History is the judge, till date no messiah has come down from the sky, but they grow up on this earth among the community.

If we had used these energies constructively (create that messiah among ourselves) to look for the solution of this problem the scenario would have been completely different. We have seen that the Muslim community in south of India are in much better position than those in the north; albeit still below the level of other community. The basic reason is that the Muslims in the south have understood the need of education and have set up institutions to provide the same. The end result is that they are economically as well as hygienically better off.

It is rightly said that that when God wants to denounce a community, the first and foremost thing that he takes away from it is the power to think rightly. If this community wants to come out of the backwardness, it should first make it imperative on itself to focus all of its energy to get literate.

Take off your blindfold

Bihar Urdu literary community loses a stalwart



Bihar Urdu literary community loses a stalwart, and feels the pain of the vacuum left by the sad demise of Janab Professor Qamar Azam Hashmi Sb. He was a renowned Urdu writer, better known as a critic with no competition, author of many books, a selfless contributor to Anjuman Taraqqie Urdu (Patna) which

he also served as its deputy chairman (1963), a widely acclaimed star of modern Urdu literature, passed away on 5th April 2012, after a prolonged illness, leaving the family and Bihar's Urdu community grief-stricken. He guided 6o students to receive PhD, and his students occupy respectable positions in all well-known universities across India.

He received the prestigious Bihar Urdu Academy Award from the hands of Nitish Kumar, chief minister of Bihar, on 23rd February 2008. Govt of Bihar conferred the Bihar Rajbhasha Urdu Sewi award entitled 'Sheikh Sharfuddin Yehya Maneri Award' for promotion of Urdu language in Bihar on Prof. (Dr.) Qamar Azam Hashmi, on 25th February 2011.

Some of his popular books are: (a) Fikr wa Fann (1963), (b) Naqsh haai rang-rang ke (1971), (c) Urdu mein Drama Nigaari (1975), (d) Zehak ka Tanqeedi Mutaála (1985), (e) Asháar-e-Akbar (1985), (f) Mashnawi Sahrul Ambiya (1985), (g) Bihar ke Nazm-Nigaar wo Shuara (1988), (h) Wardaat (1991), (i) Adbiyaat (1991), (j) Intekhab-e-Zauq, (k) Mazameen (1994), (l) Arab Emaraat ka Safari DauraniyaN (remarkable travelogue). His autobiography is titled Sarsari is jahaaN se Guzre.

Many of his former students have written books on Prof Hashmi, such as (a) Adabi Taqweemat (a collection of the critical writings of Prof.Qamar Azam Hashmi), by Dr. Arshad Masood Hashmi, published by National Council of promotion of Urdu Language (NCPUL) (b) Qamar Azam Hashimi ki tanqid nigari, by Abubakr Rizvi, and (c) Professor Qamar Azam Hashimi, Ek Hama-Jahat Shakhsiyat, by Dr. Wali AhmadWali.

Janab Qamar Azam Hashmi Sb served as member of Rajaram Ram Mohan Roy foundation (1981), as a syndicate member of Jamia Millia Islamia (1988), as member of Bihar Urdu Academy (1990), as research counselor of Bihar University (1994). He also served as court member of Aligarh Muslim University.

Prof Hashmi is remembered and honored as a strong pillar of the Urdu Movement in Bihar that led to this language becoming the second official language in Bihar. He sacrificed his time, money (whatever he had) and health for the cause of Urdu. He continued as the Vice President of the Anjuman-e-Taraqqi-e-Urdu, Bihar till June 2006. He went into seclusion after the death of Prof. (Dr.) Abdul Moghni. His name is also associated with the fearless Urdu journalism in Bihar during 1970s.

Hundreds of institutions, academic as well as social and political organizations, organized condolence meetings

across the state of Bihar and beyond. The front pages of almost all newspapers reported his death in greatly admiring tones. Hindi newspapers were far ahead in reporting the news, and claimed that Janab Qamar Azam Hashmi Sb was instrumental in churning Urdu PhDs out of Hindi writers as well.

Politicians competed with each other in releasing press-notes of condolence and visiting his rented residence in Chandwara mohalla of Muzaffarpur. Chief Minister, Mr. Nitish Kumar, was full of praise for this great son-of-the-soil, as were all prominent politicians of Bihar.

Janab Qamar Azam Hashmi Sb was born on 20th November 1942 to late Dr. Azam Sb, a freedom fighter who had to face the prison many times. He had settled in Mahdauli mohalla of Darbhanga (originally belonged to Tikauli village under Runni Saidpur block of Sitamarhi district. He was a respected professor of Bihar University wherein he also rendered his services as head of the Urdu department for a long time.

Janab Qamar Azam Hashmi Sb joined the L.S. Collge, as lecturer of Urdu and Persian, in 1970, and became Reader in

1978 to rise to the level of professor in 1986. He served the L.S. College, as its principal, from 1999 to 2001. He was also well known as a writer of dramas.

Bihar Anjuman condoles the death of an exemplary hero of literature the replacement of whom is almost impossible, and prays to the Almighty for a high place in Jannatul Firdaus. May Allah bless his four siblings (2 sons and 2 daughters) with sabr-ejameel.

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First ITI of Bihar Anjuman obtains Bihar Govt's Approval

Status Update: Inspection of ITI completed by Bihar govt. on 3rd March 2012, their report is about to be submitted to central govt, along with more than 200 pages of annexures that include supporting documents (list of equipment, rental agreement of premises, proof of industrial power connection, proof of paid electricity bills, bills of purchase of equipment, list of teaching and non-teaching staff with their CVs, qualification and experience proofs, etc.). After the central govt's inspection, approval is expected by end of May 2012, and academic session is likely to begin in June-July 2012, insha-Allah.

Fees of economically challenged minority students will need to be sponsored by individuals and NGOs. I made a surprise visit to the centre and Masa Allah I found all the

classes were being conducted at that time. I interacted with the students and had a good discussion with the students of class-9 and Class-10 and also enquired about the teaching programs and methodlogies. Ialso discussed with the



teachers if they had any issues to share with. Finally I encouraged and motivated the students and teachers to do well. Photos of my interaction in the classes with teachers and students are enclosed in this mail.

During my visit I also happened to attend the interactive session with the applicants of Class-8 aspiring to be admitted into this RCC. For the 20 seats we have received around 65 applications so far. During the session, I and Naeem sb. briefly interviewed around 40 students on that day. Barring three students, all were needy and during my interview my eyes got wet. All of them were from weakest section of the society. I wish we could took all of them but seats are limited. Photos of this interaction will be in next email because of attachment size limitation.

This time I requested the project leader to carry out door survey of the applicants also. Project Leader has agreed for this.

Announcement of final selection will be made tomorrow(29th April) along with the monthly program.

The centre has few issues pertaining to site as well as others. We are almost sure to get an alternative location. Details we would be sharing in due course.

Finally, I propose for consideration of BA, if possible, to increase one more teacher in RCC Kishanganj so that we can increase one more section for class-8 and in coming 2 years in phases for class-9

and class-10 by keeping view the fact Kishanganj has a very high population of Muslims (70%, as per official census) and poverty and illetracy are also high. This would certainly help many needy families. Kindly it may be considered.

Elementary school enrolment of Muslim kids worse than OBCs, SCs: Study

New Delhi: For the last few months, reservation for minority communities, particularly Muslims, is a subject of fierce political debate in India. The approval of 4.5 percent subquota in government jobs and educational institutions for minorities was presumably to improve their economic and educational backwardness. However, as the data on the enrolment of Muslims in elementary schools shows, reservation in jobs and in higher educational institutions cannot be the only solution to bring the community into the mainstream.

The data, released by the National University of Educational Planning and Administration (NUEPA), suggests that the enrolment of Muslim children at the elementary level is nowhere near the national average. With a 10.49% enrolment in elementary schools, Muslims fare worse than the OBCs (42.26%) and the SCs (19.72%). In the Hindi-speaking states (Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan) as well as in Goa, Gujarat and Maharashtra, the gap in enrolment of Muslims at the elementary level to the proportion of their population is higher.

Further, the comparison of enrolment at elementary level between the SCs, OBCs and Muslims shows that the OBCs and SCs are doing much better than Muslims. The low enrolment percentage shows that even the Sarva Shiksha Abhyan (SSA), the national flagship programme for the universalisation of elementary education, has not been effective in bringing the Muslim children to primary schools despite the minorities being the special focus of the programme.

There are various factors, according to the study. On top is of course their economic condition. Most of the parents preferred to engage their children in economically-productive activities rather than getting them educated.

Another problem was their ghettoisation. Compared to the overall urban population in India (27.8 %), a higher percentage of Muslims (35.7 %) live in cities, according to the Sachar Committee report. However, most of the urban Muslims live in ghettos where there are generally no or fewer schools.

During a study conducted in the Muslim localities of Delhi by the Cenre of Media Studies Social, it was observed that in areas where schools were available, they were found to be inadequate to the proportion of the population of the localities. It was also observed that due to insufficient open spaces in these localities, there was no scope to open new schools. Alternative arrangements such as mobile schools may address the problem.

On a positive note, the data shows that the percentage of girls in the total Muslim enrolment is much better (49.20%) than even the OBC girls (48.22%) and SC girls (48.09%). The data therefore goes against the general perception that Muslims do not allow their girl child to go for formal education.

The moot question is: will the Right to Education Act ensure more opportunities for Muslim children and ensure a better future for them?
